Ground COVERS

Ground covers are the key to completing any landscaped garden; they are the stalwarts in the garden and are ridiculously easy to grow; they are easy on the wallet and the bonus is that where ground covers flourish you will not have any weeds growing as they suppress weed germination.

Sun lovers ground covers

Parahebe masses of sky blue flowers. Verbena bushy mass of pink flowers. Geranium Incanum silvery leaves with mauve flowers.

Shade loving ground covers

Sutera white and mauve small flowers in mass Lamium fast growing yellow-green leaves rose-pink flowers Ajuga shiny metallic leaves, dark blue flowers.

Most of us make some or other new years resolutions - how about making some gardening resolutions for 2012?

Hmmm, just when you thought there was nothing to do in the garden?

1) Firstly to improve our soil, by adding plenty of compost.

2) To water thoroughly once or twice a week rather than a daily sprinkling; as this encourages root systems to grown downwards in search of water.

3) To spray only when it is absolutely necessary.

4) One of my favourites – do not to procrastinate! Bend down and pull out that weed as <u>soon</u> as you see it, this way we will not allow them to set seeds and spread further.

5) Carry a pair of secateurs with you in the garden to remove any diseased or dead flowers whilst walking in the garden.

6) To walk round your garden after a rainfall, to see what area's did not receive rain (either because of a large tree or shrub) or to see if there are any area's that have a drainage problem?

7) Keep a dairy, as this takes the guess work out of gardening; on a personal note, I do not want to plant something that has not worked for me previously: surprising how we forget what we have had success or failure with. A dairy will remind you of what flowers when and for how long, also this is a get way of keeping notes on the various plants in your garden.

8) But most importantly to make a note to ENJOY our gardens (it can't just be all about hard work!) and of course to share the fruits of our labour with friends and family.
